Social Capital Theory – Cognitive: The cognitive dimension is also defined as resources developing shared vision, interpretations and feelings among actors (Nahapiet & Ghoshal 1998). Similarly, Schein (1985, p.12) defines organizational culture as “the correct way to perceive, think, and feel” in order to solve organizational problems. Based on this view, culture could be assumed to be a critical resource for developing a shared interpretation which enhances social capital.
