Clearly, however, the medieval Islamic hospital was a more elaborate institution with a wider range of functions.

Islamic Culture and the Medical Arts: Hospitals

The first hospital in the Islamic World was built in Damascus in 706 by Umayyad Caliph Walid ibn Abdul al-Malik (668-715) which catered to the sick, the blind, and the lepers. All medical care was free. It employed many physicians. Its staff, organization and equipment served as a model for later hospitals.
